

## 25th Avenue Grade Separation Project UPCOMING EL CAMINO REAL LANE CLOSURES

Dear Caltrain Neighbor,

As San Mateo's 25th Avenue Grade Separation Project progresses toward its goals to improve safety, and reduce traffic congestion and train horn noise, there will be traffic pattern changes due to construction we wish to make you aware of:

## EL CAMINO REAL LANE CLOSURES (before and after 31st Avenue)

On June 23 through June 25, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., there will be lane closures on El Camino Real. The closures will be both northbound and southbound, just before and after 31st Avenue (see map below). During the closure, bi-directional traffic will be allowed, with cones, signs, arrow boards, and other traffic control devices installed to help safely navigate around the closures.

In addition, the left-turn lane on southbound El Camino Real will remain closed for approximately 4 weeks (see map below). The closure will only be in effect weekdays from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.,

between June 23 and July 22. This closure is necessary to complete turn modifications in preparation for the opening of the 31<sup>st</sup> Ave connection.



Turn Lane Closure, Weekdays 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM, beginning Wednesday, June 23 through approximately Thursday, July 22

Please note unintended schedule changes do occur, and we thank you in advance for your patience. These activities will help bring the project one-step closer to creating the long-awaited east-west connections for pedestrians, cyclists, and vehicles in San Mateo.
