#### **Transit Oriented Communities (TOC)**

- ✓ Joint Planning Committee
- ✓ Metropolitan Transportation Commission
- TOC Policy applies to areas in local jurisdictions within ½ mile of the following types of existing and planned transit stops and stations:



- Regional Rail: Caltrain, BART
- Commuter Rail: Capitol Corridor, ACE, SMART, Valley Link
- Light Rail: MuniMetro, VTA
- Bus Rapid Transit: AC Transit, Muni BRT
- Ferries: WETA, Golden Gate Transit
- Local jurisdictions grouped into four tiers based on levels of service.









### **Transit Oriented Communities (TOC)**

- TOC Policy requirements include four elements that apply to local jurisdictions:
  - 1. Minimum required and allowed residential and/or commercial office densities for new development;
  - 2. Policies focused on housing production, preservation and protection, commercial anti-displacement policies;
  - 3. Parking management;
  - 4. Transit station access and circulation.









### **Transit Oriented Communities (TOC)**

- ✓ Metropolitan Transportation Commission
- Presented to the July 8 Joint MTC Planning and ABAG Administrative Committee.



- Changes to final draft made based on committee and community member comments.
- Final draft TOC Policy adopted by MTC on September 28.
- MTC staff to provide additional guidance regarding documentation and compliance within six months and report back to committees and MTC.
- County & Local Program grant funds to be tied to TOC Policy compliance, as will regional discretionary funding for transit projects.






### **Major Project Advancement Policy (MAP)**

- Goal of MAP is (1) to support **Plan Bay Area 2050** implementation, and (2) sequence and prioritize discretionary funding for regionally significant projects:
  - Megaprojects, including Caltrain Electrification and DTX
  - High-performing, low-cost smaller projects to improve local and regional transit networks and multimodal facilities
  - Transit fleet transitions to Zero Emission vehicles







### **Major Project Advancement Policy (MAP)**

- ☐ Programming and Allocations Committee
- ☐ Metropolitan Transportation Commission

- To be included in the MAP, a project must be:
  - Seeking competitive federal, state, or regional grant opportunities and
  - Be included in Plan Bay Area 2050
- Projects are then sorted into **three levels** based on **readiness**:
  - Level 1: more than 50% committed funding, construction start by 2028 or FFGA / EPD
  - Level 2: more than 30% committed funding, construction start by 2035
  - Level 3: less than 30% funding or construction start after 2035

#### Next Steps:

- October 26 adoption action for (1) funding endorsements and (2) an update to the MTC TIRCP framework in advance of the Fall 2022 Augmentation Call for Projects.
- January February timeframe for MAP Policy Reinforcements and Risk Management Principles.
- Caltrain staff continuing to engage MTC staff leadership on funding endorsements table and future role of MAP in project risk management.
- MTC staff to provide annual updates, including refined endorsements table for federal and state discretionary grant programs.





- Blue Ribbon Task Force's *Transit Transformation Action Plan* identified the need for a new regional transportation measure.
- Plan Bay Area 2050 assumes a new regional transportation measure no later than 2030.
- MTC staff proposing stakeholder engagement this fall / winter:
  - MTC Programming & Allocations Committee
  - MTC Policy Advisory Council
  - Joint MTC ABAG Legislation Committee
  - Elected Officials
  - Transit Operators
  - General Public







### **Regional Transportation Measure Update**

☐ Programming and Allocations Committee

MTC staff is focused on a regional housing measure for the November 2024 ballot.



- Decision on specific ballot measure(s) not planned until **mid-2024**, but polling suggests that two regional measures is inadvisable.
- MTC staff and other regional stakeholders have advised that transit operators focus on a non-ballot measure strategy to avoid operating deficits expected to begin in FY2024.
- To be discussed at the Programming and Allocations Committee (PAC) on October 12.
